POLICY CITATION

In accordance with Regents' Policy 05.12.042, Formal Project Approval (FPA) represents approval of the Project including the program justification and need, scope, the Total Project Cost (TPC), and funding plan for the project. It also represents authorization to complete the development of the project through the schematic design, targeting the approved scope and budget, unless otherwise designated by the approval authority.

An FPA is required for all projects with an estimated TPC in excess of \$2.5 million in order for that project's inclusion of construction funding to be included in the university's capital budget request, unless otherwise approved by the Board.

The level of approval required shall be based upon TPC as follows:

- TPC > \$4 million will require approval by the Board based on recommendations from the Facilities and Land Management Committee (F&LMC).
- TPC > \$2 million but ≤ \$4 million will require approval by the F&LMC.
- TPC > \$1 million but \leq \$2 million will require approval by the Chairperson of the F&LMC.
- TPC ≤ \$1 million will require approval by the university's Chief Finance Officer (CFO) or designee.

RATIONALE AND RECOMMENDATION

Background

The Harper Building, adjacent to the UAF campus, houses the Interior Aleutians Campus (IAC) administration for the campus. IAC submitted and was granted a 2-year renovation grant through the U.S. Department of Education, Title 3 program for renovations to the Harper Building. The grant will have a direct impact on IAC's ability to provide adequate facilities to meet basic needs for their increased student body. It will also facilitate more efficient administrative functions and aid long-term fiscal stability through cost controls in energy efficiency.

The recent addition to the Harper Building, funded through a Title 3 grant, reconfigured space formally used by the Campus Director and her staff, and added a science classroom and offices for additional faculty. Consequently, the remainder of the Harper Building now requires some renovation work to accommodate the changes.

Project Scope

This project will provide upgrades in four areas of the Harper Building: 1) restroom expansion, 2) office space renovation of the open northwest corner of the building into the executive office suite, 3) roof replacement, and 4) energy efficiency improvements through lighting and window upgrades. Due to the individual nature of the projects and the timing of the grant funding being available, the work will be accomplished with a series of smaller projects, rather than one large one.

The current restroom size is inadequate for the IAC program. Intensive classes are held on a regular basis with up to 30 students at a time. Most of these students are women. During the short breaks that the classes take, the restroom cannot handle the required use. Additionally, the drainage system to the restroom is a constant maintenance issue for Facilities Services. These issues will be addressed in this project.

The building roof is 35 years old and is experiencing the effects of age. The insulation has become saturated with water, and it has lost its effectiveness, plus it is adding a weight burden to the roof structure.

Lighting upgrades will help reduce electrical costs. Replacement of the 35 year old wooden sash windows will increase energy efficiency, and will provide a more comfortable working environment for the IAC staff.


