### Why Bones?

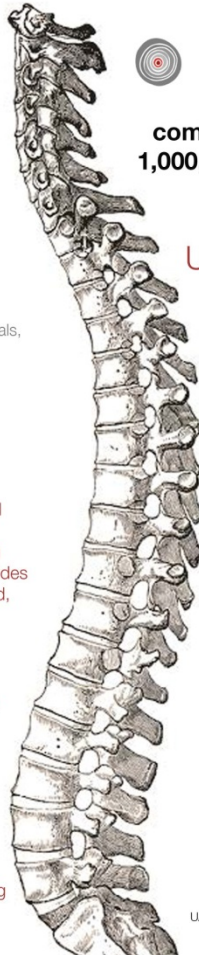
Bones are universal. Bones are strong. Bones symbolize our common humanity. And, they are poignant reminders of unnecessary and preventable loss. They are the physical evidence that individuals, people, ever existed.

The bone laying is the intersection of art and activism, of education and action.

One Million Bones is a large-scale social arts practice. That integrates education and hands on art making to raise awareness of genocides and atrocities going on around the world, this very day.

The one million bones will be collected from across the country and installed on the National Mall in Washington, DC, June 2013 to offer a visible petition, to remember victims and survivors, to bring awareness to the issue. Take part by making a bone and joining the Students Rebuild challenge.

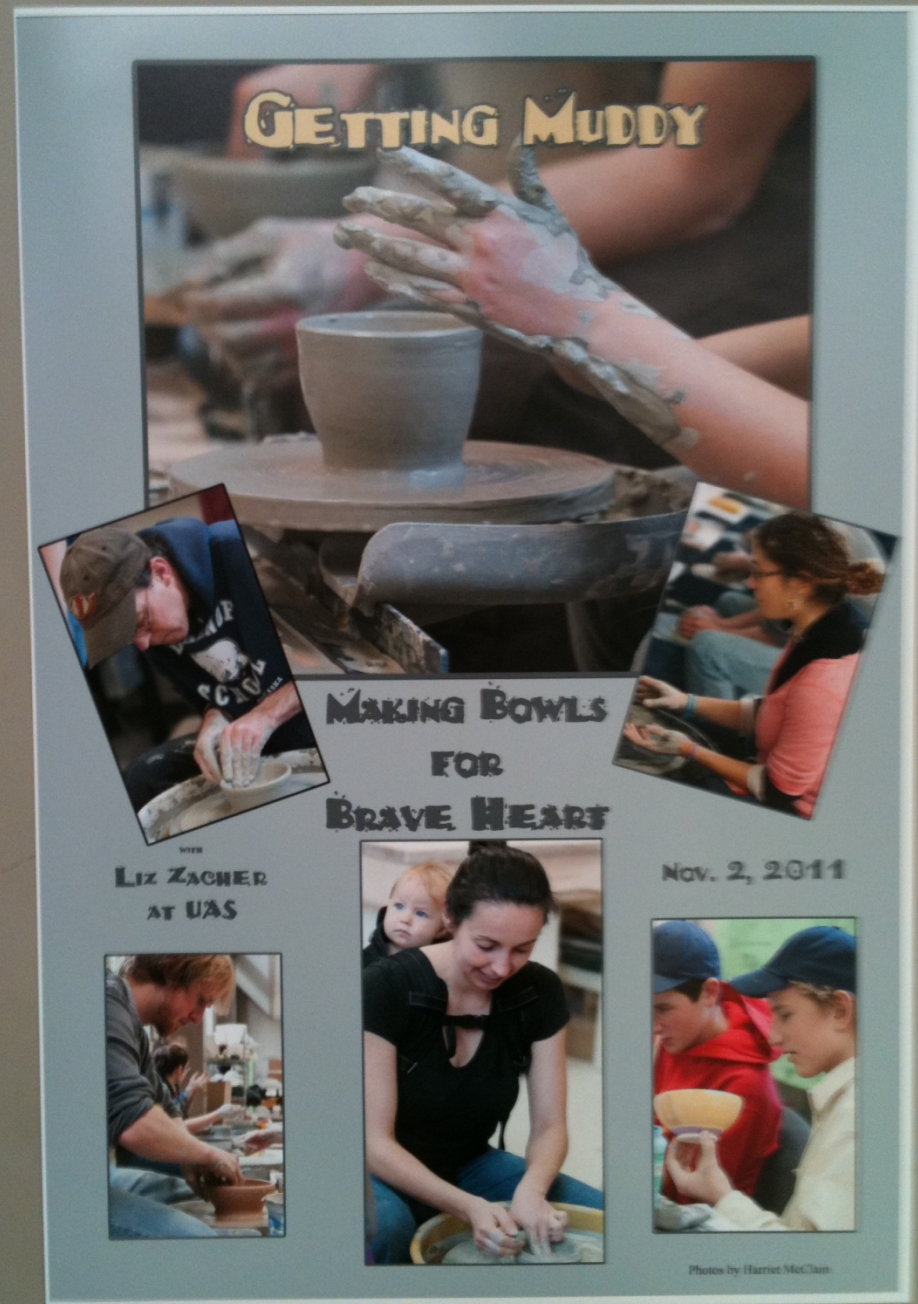

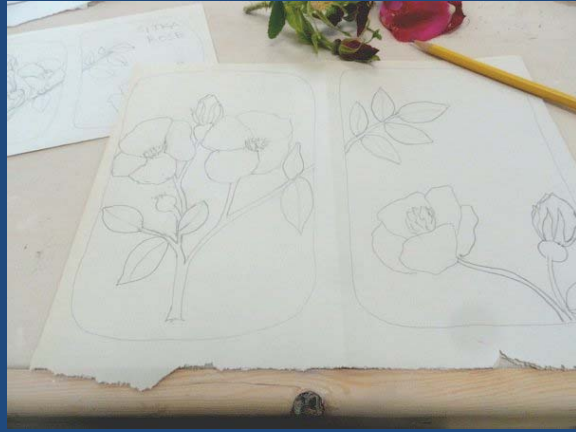

## Expressive Alterations: Designing Non-round Functional Pottery

UAS Visiting Artist Workshop with

Jan 7-8th. Saturday/ Sunday 9am-5pm

Join Deb Schwartzkopf at UAS Sitka Campus for a clay based, two day workshop. Demonstrations will approach the functional vessel from a stand point of shape. Hands on exercises will offer a chance to problem-solve, and practice combining parts and pieces.

Pattern making will be covered as we hand build with slabs. In addition we will shape the slabs with coiled, clay bisque molds we make in session. Simple thrown pieces will be cut and altered. In the end, all these approaches will be combined to making non-round, expressive shapes.

While making, Deb will also discuss the way she thinks about surface and how it can change the way the form is perceived and what she intends it to communicate. This workshop will offer many different examples of building with clay what will enrich the skills of both the hand builder and the wheel thrower.

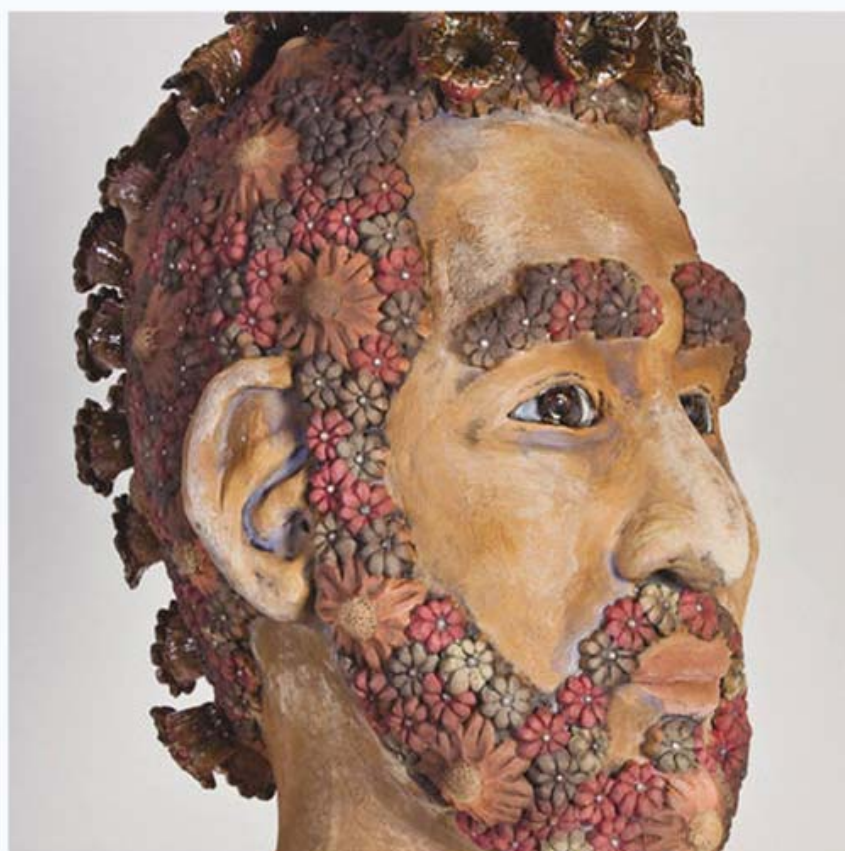

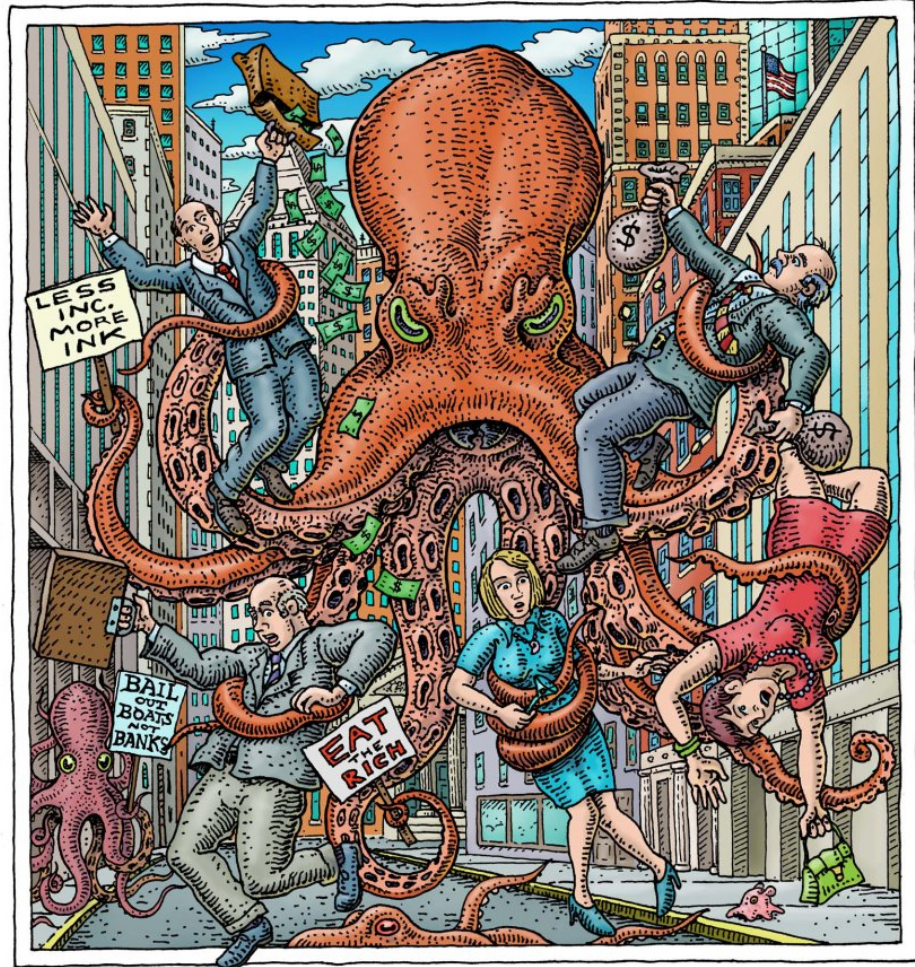
