Hope all have taken time to read sgc constitution, important to understand your roles and are representing your constituencies to a changing administration. Saw this is an important avenue for obtaining information—primary role unless a strong issue arises affecting all groups. Bring a clear short description of what is going on with individual groups. Biggest issue is replacing the president; wrote a letter requesting that governance be included in the search process. Re nonretention, uaf chancellor understands that nonretention has been misused. See initial Sgc resolution and president's report. Hopes to see this group have a lot of input into the pres search process. Hope administration is light on its feet to deal with budget reductions. So much focus on the bottom line that we lose focus on the faculty staff and students—the human elements and often with a long term cost greater than short term savings.

The BoR is the search committee. Governance sits on the advisory committee only and the BoR believes the advisory committee's work is done. It is unlikely that anyone will see applications until the finalists show up. Next sgc officer should write a letter to them outlining how the exclusion from the presidential search process. Dehn's impression is that the advertisement is now out; names are being taken. The BoR expects on campus visits in February. The BoR believes that they are the hiring authority and it is their one constitutional duty.

The advisory committee will have no further input into the process.

Best impact would be if a letter could go forward from sgc with every member's signature on it. Do we want more involvement in the final candidate vetting, feedback etc.

Ask the BoR to clarify how the committee charge will be played out in the selection process. Jon Dehn drafting the letter; Genie babb will help as will Martin Klein.

FA is working on AMP and...wonderful meeting with Hamilton and supported student wages. Biggest is amp, very controversial waiting for input from campuses. Two issues are paramount, lack of money and the ability of uaa to offer PhDs. This is to be a short document ; cliff notes version of the BoR policies. BoR wants an amp that puts universities in their lanes and guides the BoR in distribution of the diminishing money. Concern about Phd issue is at statewide, not at the campuses. The faculty don't see why we cant follow BoR policy. Question is mute; uaa doesn't have the infrastructure yet and we have time to help them get there. Now going to divide the plan into two, one is an academic program evaluation for SAC use. UAA has withdrawn from the discussions because the president refuses to allow phd's in Anchorage.

Babb hasn't had any information about the uaa withdrawal but has a meeting with acad vc on Wednesday. Apparently the chancellors are meeting with SAC to fix the problem.
