

**The following are examples of Posting Summaries used with various UA positions:**

[AHAINA](#) is an acronym for African American, Hispanic, Asian, International and Native American. AHAINA's objective is to create responsive and efficient student support systems which recruits, sustains, counsels, documents, and also integrates students into the university community. AHAINA programs assist in the increased retention and graduation rate of students by providing them with an amiable and stimulating social and intellectual environment.

AHAINA Student Programs provides culturally relevant programs and services to support students to achieve their higher education goals while at the University of Alaska Anchorage (UAA). AHAINA also serves prospective students who live in other communities, both in-state and out-of-state.

[Facilities Planning and Construction](#) (FP&C) is responsible for planning, budgeting, contract management, and construction of professionally designed buildings and facilities for the [University of Alaska Anchorage](#) (UAA) campus and its extended community campuses - [Kenai Peninsula College](#) (including [Kachemak Bay Branch](#)), [Kodiak College](#), [Matanuska-Susitna College](#) and [Prince William Sound Community College](#).

UAA, excluding the community campuses, encompasses over 369 acres, has 47 buildings consisting of 1.8 million gross square feet and 35 acres of asphalt parking acres. The combined community campuses consist of 20 buildings and 290,000 gross square feet. The primary focus of FP&C is to ensure new construction, major renovations and alterations are designed to support the mission of the university and that physical development meets academic program requirements in support of all UAA campuses.

The Project Manager/Designer will be responsible for space planning and design for projects involving departmental moves, expansions and new programs. The manager will work with members of the university community and outside consultants to develop architectural program statements and designs for capital projects outlined in the University's Campus Facilities Master Plan. This individual will be a creative problem solver for university space issues by providing the optimal space solution within the budget and time constraints of each project.

The mission of the University of Alaska Anchorage (UAA) [Nursing Program](#) is to educate students for productive citizenship, personal growth, and professional nursing practice. The department offers undergraduate students two options: the Associate of Applied Science in nursing and the Bachelor of Science in nursing science. These programs are designed to reflect Alaska's needs and health care delivery systems, although graduates are prepared for beginning practice positions in other geographic areas as well.

The School of Nursing also offers graduate studies at the master's level with a primary emphasis on advanced professional nursing practice, theory, research, and health care delivery systems. Graduate students may develop a specialized practice focus in community health nursing, psychiatric-mental health nursing, health care administration, or as a family nurse practitioner. Master's level studies provide the student with a basis for further study at the doctoral level.
