

## **Enrollment Summary: Headcount, Credit Hours and Full-Time Equivalents**

In fall 2007 there were 32,166 students enrolled for credit at the University of Alaska. This represents a two percent decrease from the fall 2006 enrollment of 32,836, and a five percent decrease from the fall 2003 total headcount of 33,900. However, enrollment of first-time freshmen increased nearly four percent over the past five years, from 2,841 in fall 2003 to 2,942 in fall 2007 (Tables 1.01 and 1.10). Additional highlights follow:

Full-time students accounted for 38 percent of UA's total student population, an increase of two percent from fall 2003. Among the MAUs, UAF had the largest proportion of full-time students in fall 2007 with 43 percent (Table 1.02).

In fall 2007, as in previous years, women accounted for the largest proportion of students at each MAU, with UAS leading at 66 percent, followed by UAA with 61 percent, and UAF with 59 percent (Table 1.04). Nationally, the proportion of women on university campuses in 2004 was 57 percent (NCES, 2005). Students reporting a minority ethnic background accounted for 25 percent of all UA students in fall 2007 (Table 1.04). While the number of minority students attending UA decreased by nearly two percent between 2003 and 2007, the number of students whose ethnicity was not reported increased by twelve percent during the same period of time (Table 1.03).

Alaska residents constituted 90 percent of UA's fall 2007 student population (Table 1.06).

In fall 2007, first-time freshmen (FTF) constituted fifteen percent of UA's degree-seeking student population, and nine percent of the overall student headcount (Table 1.09). At the MAU level, FTF accounted for sixteen percent of the degree-seeking student population at UAF, fifteen percent at UAA, and nine percent at UAS. The number of other freshmen (not first-time) increased by one percent at UAA between 2003 and 2007, but decreased by nineteen percent at both UAF and UAS, resulting in a seven percent decrease at the system level (Table 1.09). The number of degree-seeking students has increased by five percent since fall 2003; however, this gain has been tempered by a seventeen percent decrease in the number of non-degree-seeking students attending UA in the past five years.

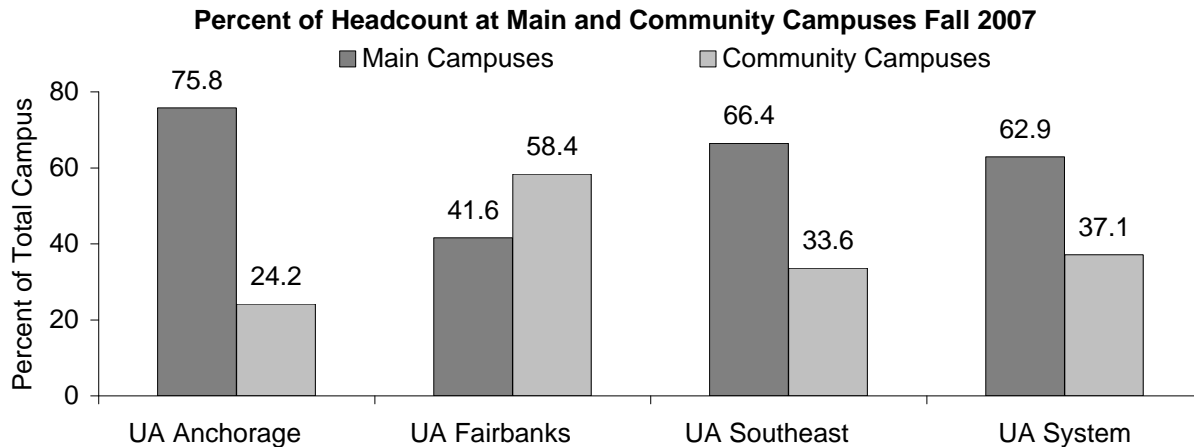
Degree-seeking students constituted 61 percent of the UA student population in fall 2007. Of the total number of students enrolled within the UA system, twenty percent were freshmen, eleven percent were sophomores, nine percent were juniors, fourteen percent were seniors, and seven percent were graduate students. Students who were non-degree-seeking or who had not formally declared a degree program at the campus in which they were enrolled accounted for the remaining 40 percent of students.

The bulk of student credit hours (SCH) delivered throughout the UA system in fall 2007 were in lower division courses, accounting for 70 percent of total SCH delivered. Upper division courses accounted for eighteen percent of SCH delivered, graduate level courses six percent, and professional courses two percent (Table 1.19). UAA delivered 64 percent of all UA lower division SCH, while UAF delivered 29 percent and UAS delivered eight percent. UAF delivered 46 percent of UA's graduate level SCH, UAA delivered 43 percent and UAS delivered 11 percent (Table 1.19).

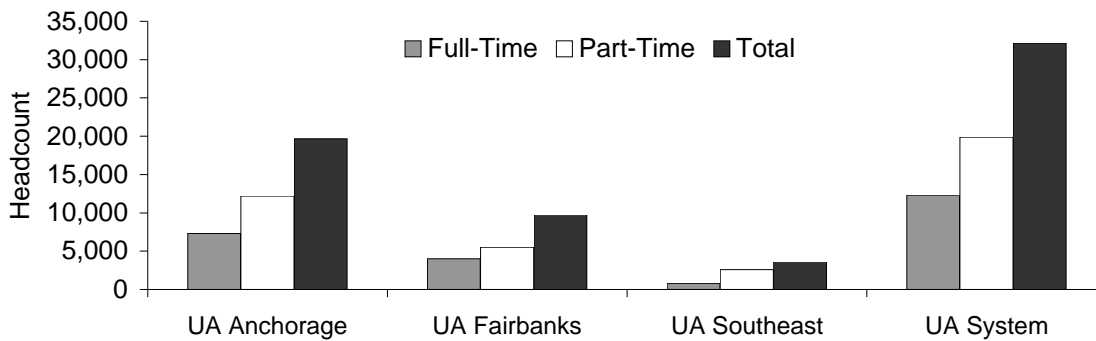

Fall 2007**



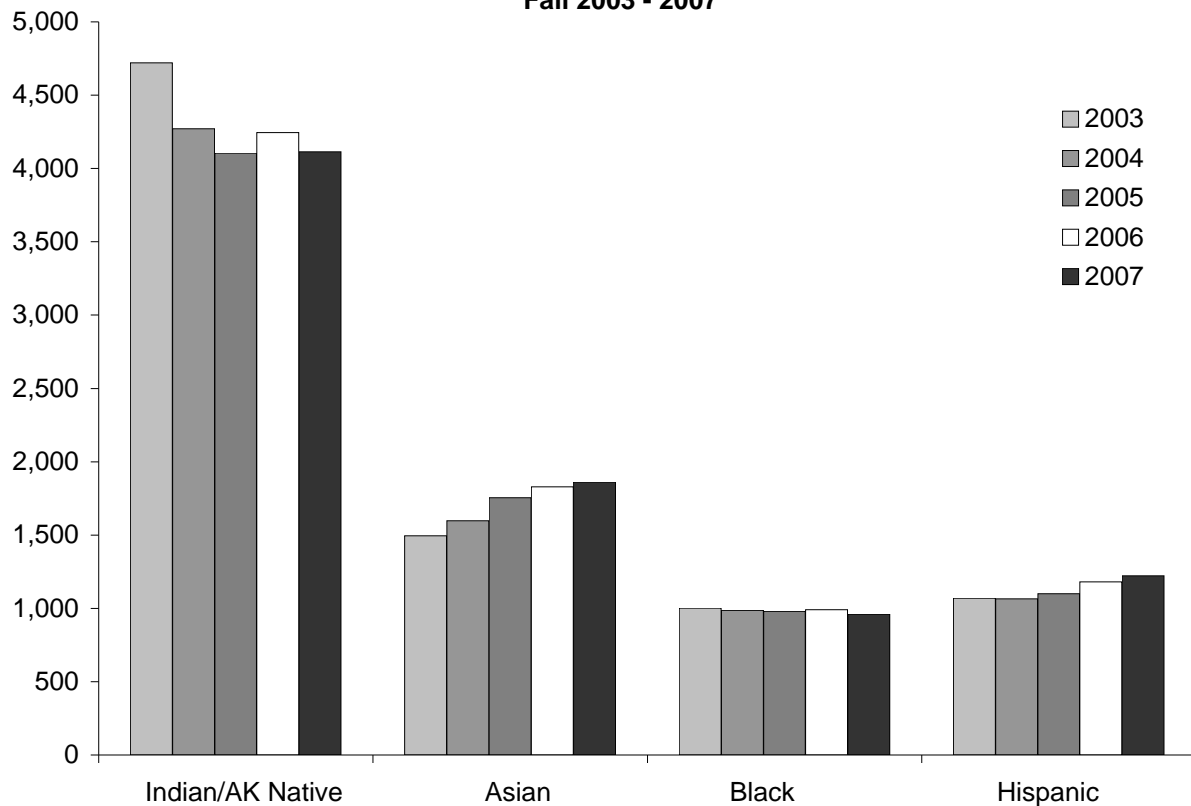

Students are categorized into one of three levels: part-time at the MAU and system level; full-time at the system level but part-time at the MAU level (indicated by inclusion in the 'UA full-time' headcount); or full-time at the system and MAU levels (indicated by inclusion in the 'MAU full-time' headcount). For example: 1) An undergraduate enrolled for a total of 12 SCH, 9 at Fairbanks and 3 at Anchorage, would be included in the UA full-time count for UA Fairbanks and the UA full-time count for UA Anchorage. 2) An undergraduate enrolled for a total of 15 SCH, 12 at Juneau and 3 at Fairbanks would be included in the MAU full-time count for UA Southeast and in the UA full-time count for UA Fairbanks. In 2004, 57 percent of all university students nationwide were women (NCES Digest of Education Statistics, 2005). Women comprise a higher percent of students at UA than the national average. In 2007, women constituted 66 percent of the student body at UA Southeast, 61 percent at UA Anchorage and 59 percent at UA Fairbanks. Women generally comprised a much higher percentage of students at community campuses, constituting for between roughly 60 percent and 80 percent of the students. Only Fairbanks Campus and PWSCC have a lower percentage of women than the national average.

The University of Alaska has a significantly older student population than students attending higher education nationally. At UA, 47.6 percent of the students were under 25 years of age, while 38.3 percent were 30 or older. Nationally, 60.9 percent of students were under 25 and 25.9 percent of students were over 30 in 2004 (NCES, Digest of Education Statistics, 2005).

Since 1990, the attendance of younger students has increased at UA. The proportion of students who were under 25 years of age increased from 31 percent in 1990 to 48 percent in fall 2007.

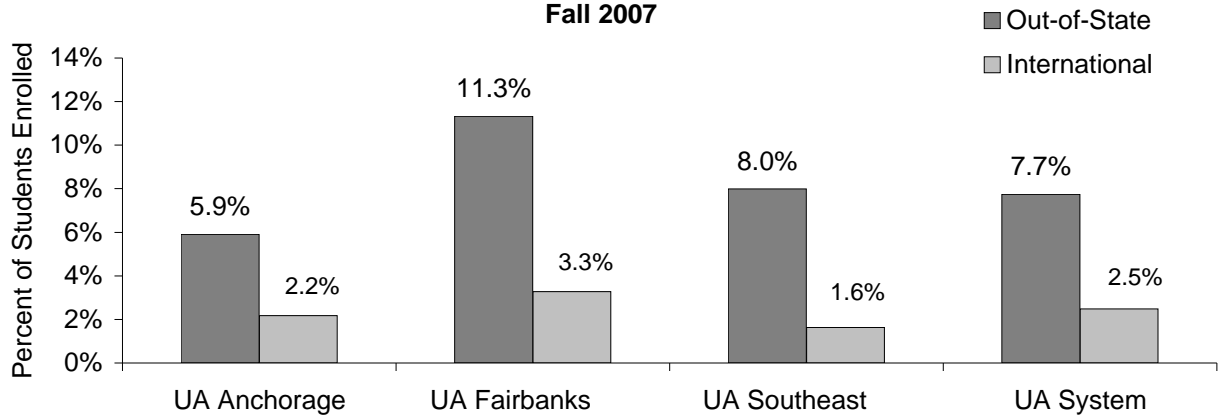

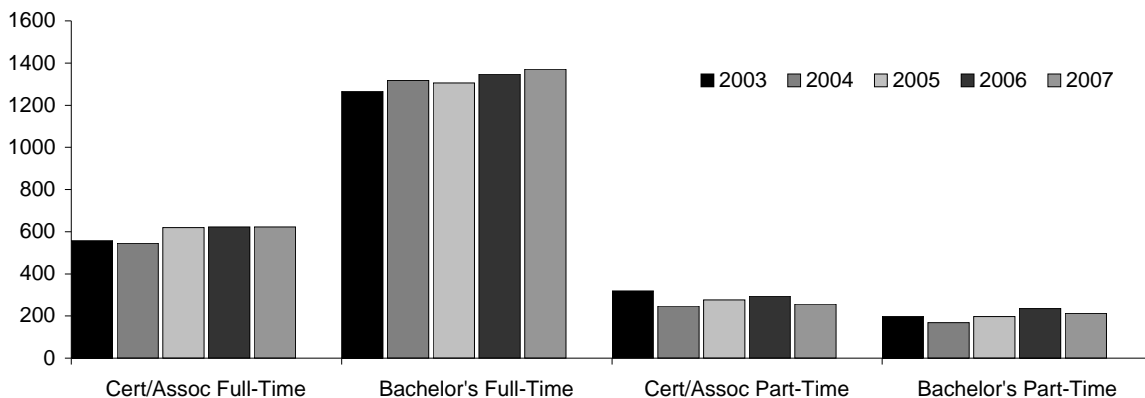

**Alaska First Time Freshmen by Degree-Seeking- and Full-Time Status**



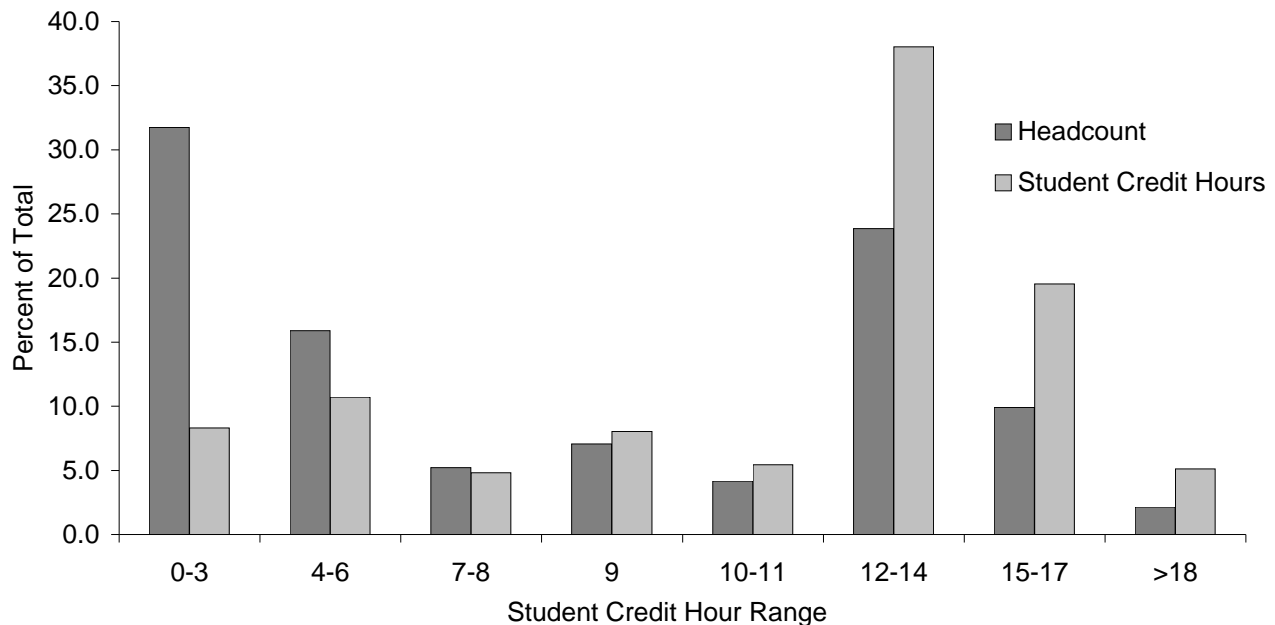

Fall 2007**



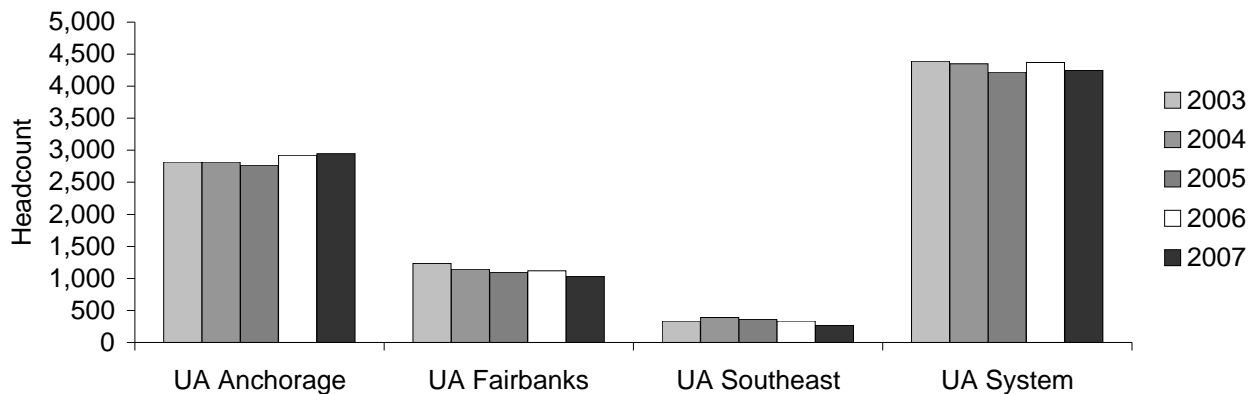

Fall 2003 - 2007**



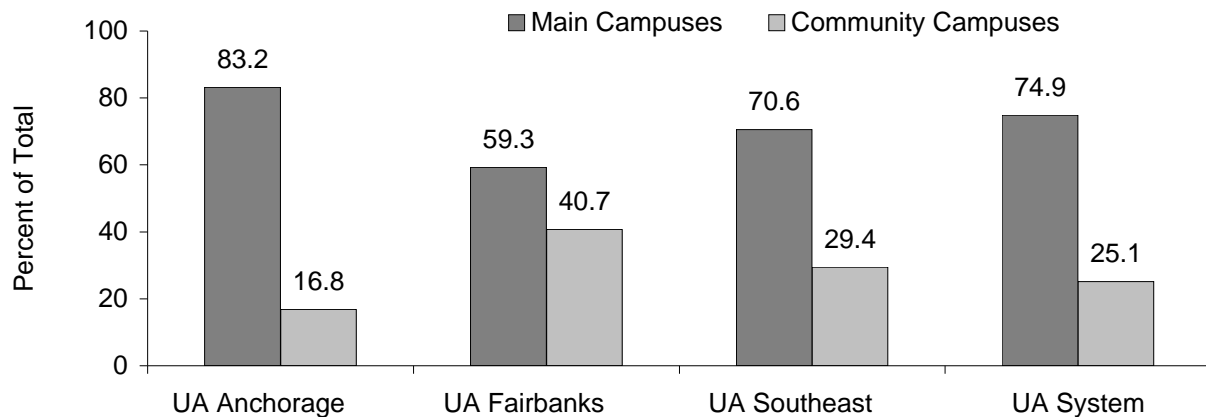

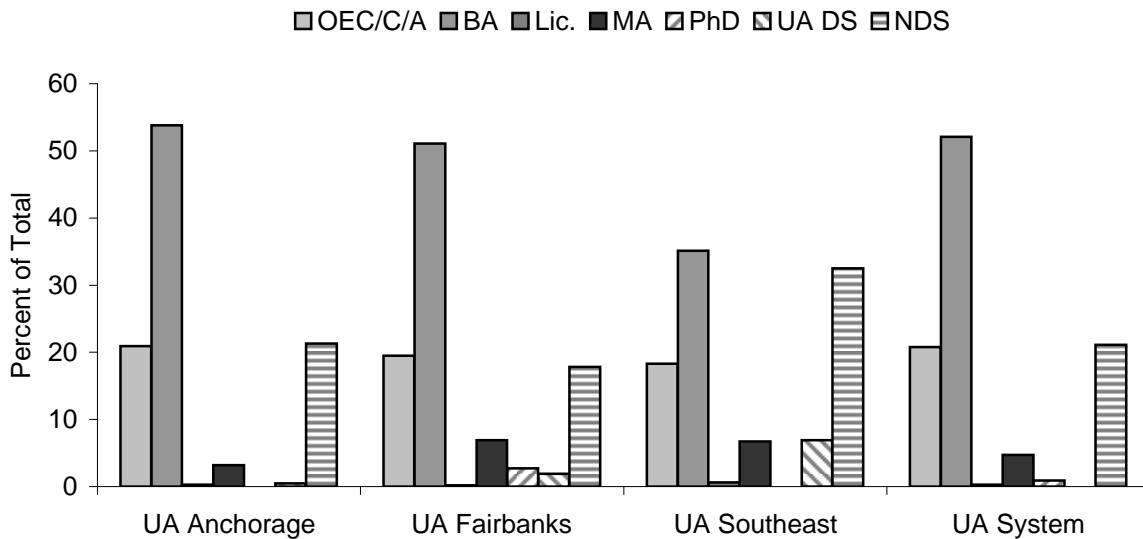

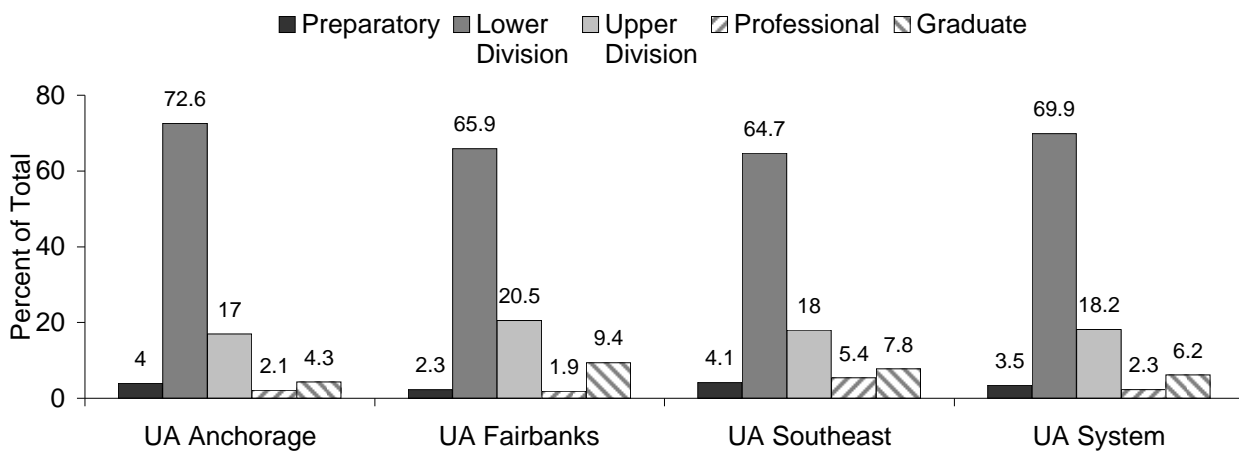

Fall 2007**



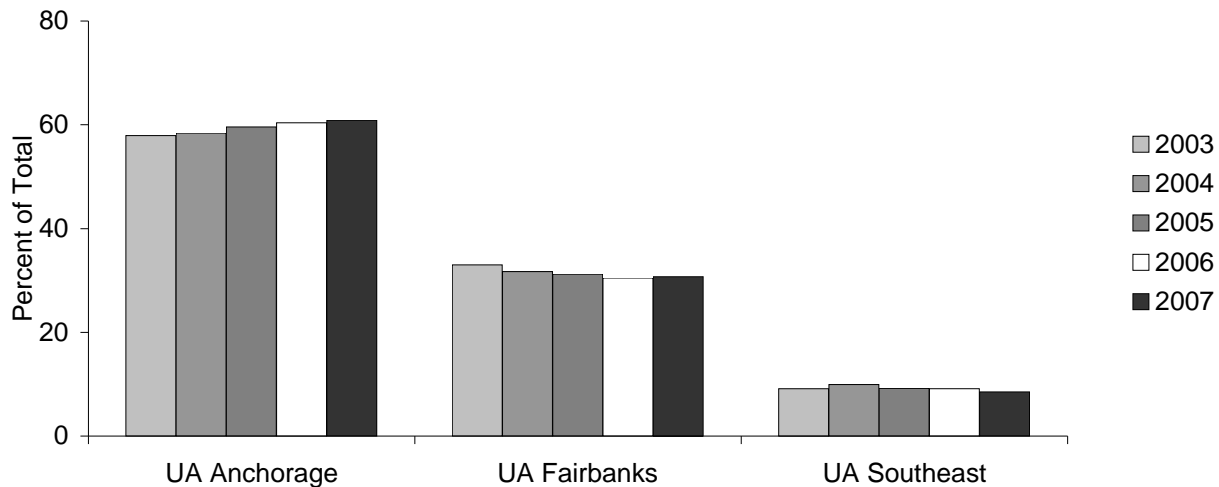

Fall 2003-2007**



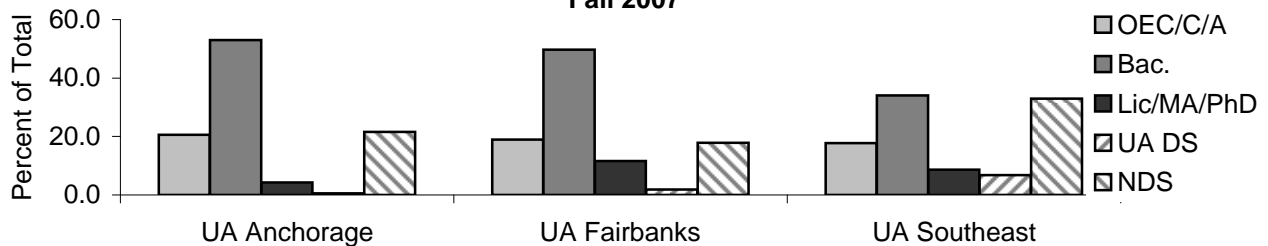

## **Summary: UA Scholars**

The UA Scholars Program is a four-year scholarship providing partial payment of tuition and fees at any University of Alaska campus. This program was designed to help reduce the number of Alaska high school graduates who leave the state for higher education. Prior to implementation of the UA Scholars Program in 1999, it is estimated that approximately 100 students from the top 10 percent of Alaska high school graduates enrolled at the University of Alaska. Today, UA attracts over 400 new Alaska high school graduates in the top ten percent of their class each year.

This program has been offered to the top ten percent of graduating seniors at each qualified Alaska high school since 1999, with the first class of UA Scholars starting its education at the University of Alaska that fall. Enrollment in the UA Scholars Program has increased over time, significantly reducing the number of Alaska high school graduates who leave the state to pursue their postsecondary education. During its inaugural semester in fall 1999, the UA Scholars program attracted 271 top Alaskan students to the University of Alaska (Table 1.23). By fall 2007, the number of new UA Scholars had grown to 416, an increase of 54 percent. Of the 416 new Scholars enrolling in fall 2007, 235 enrolled at UA Anchorage, 172 at UA Fairbanks, and 13 at UA Southeast (Table 1.24). Four Scholars were enrolled in courses at more than one MAU.

Seventy-eight percent of UA Scholars were enrolled in baccalaureate degree programs in fall 2007, eleven percent were enrolled in certificate or associate degree programs, and three percent were continuing in graduate degree programs (Table 1.26). Only undergraduate students are eligible to receive the scholarship; however, a growing number of UA Scholars remain for graduate study. The most popular program was Nursing/Pre-major Nursing at UA Anchorage, which enrolled 96 UA Scholars in fall 2007 (Table 1.27b), while the most popular discipline was Letters, Communication, and Philosophy, with 273 UA Scholars declaring majors in this area (Table 1.27a).

Since the inception of the program in 1999, 842 UA Scholars have earned a total of 969 degrees from the University of Alaska, beginning in FY01 (Table 1.29).

The UA Scholars Award is a four-year scholarship, totaling \$11,000, awarded to the top 10 percent of graduating seniors from Alaska high schools who enroll in the University of Alaska system. Since the UA Scholars program began in fall 1999, a cumulative total of 3,805 students have enrolled and received a UA Scholars distribution from the University of Alaska. This illustrates the overall impact this program has had on Alaska and its residents.

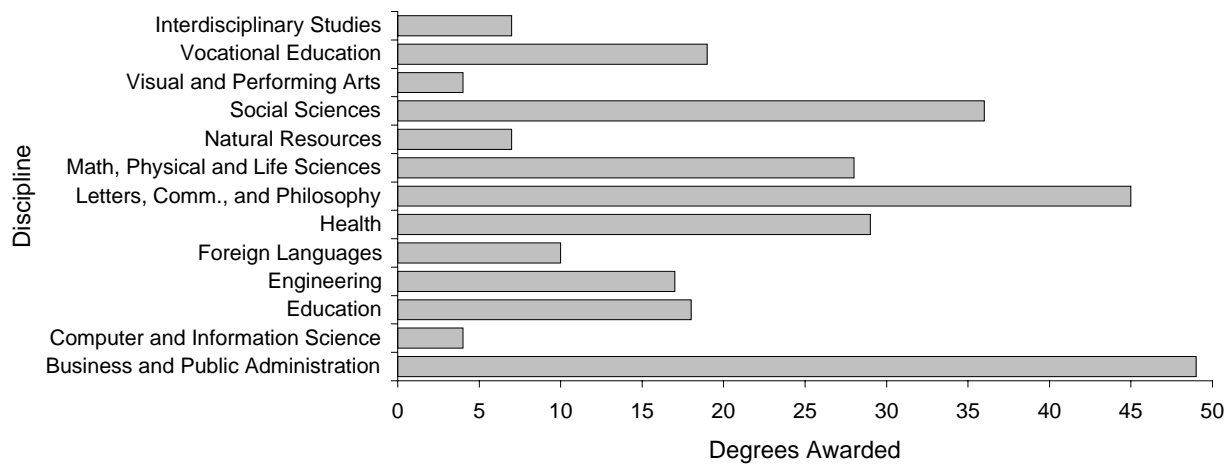
