
TRANSFORMING EDUCATION TO CAREER OUTCOMES

Graduates of Anchorage 2-year degree and certificate programs see a substantial return on investment, with those graduating between FY17 and FY21 experiencing a 52 percent increase in their annual earnings just one year after completing their credential. This immediate salary boost underscores the effectiveness of UA programs in rapidly enhancing the earning potential of its students while meeting our state's workforce needs.




ENROLLMENT PROFILE
