TRANSFORMING EDUCATION TO CAREER OUTCOMES

Graduates of Kodiak College programs see a substantial return on investment, with those graduating between FY17 and FY21 experiencing an 11 percent increase in their annual earnings just one year after completing their credential. This immediate salary boost underscores the effectiveness of UA programs in rapidly enhancing the earning potential of its students while meeting our state’s workforce needs.





PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Kodiak College, UAA, puts students first through innovative teaching, individualized support, and responsive service to community needs. The college offers academic and technical programs that prepare students for Alaska’s workforce and beyond—ranging from Accounting, Anthropology, and Education to industry recognized certificates in Welding Technology, Marine Services Technology, and Private Pilot Ground School.

The Alutiiq Language OEC, developed with the Alutiiq Museum, supports cultural preservation and language revitalization. Through partnerships with local and statewide organizations, students can complete Nursing and Medical Assisting programs locally and access low- or no-cost dual credit opportunities for high school students.



COMMUNITY IMPACT

Kodiak College fuels local growth through apprenticeships, workforce training, and community partnerships. By collaborating with schools, businesses, and tribal organizations, the college connects students to career-ready jobs and hands-on learning in fields such as welding, education, maritime services, and healthcare.
