




The 2024 Summer Fire Academy graduates following the CTC summer graduation ceremony on Aug. 16, 2024. UAF photo by Leif Van Cise.

### TRANSFORMING EDUCATION TO CAREER OUTCOMES

Graduates of UAF CTC programs see a substantial return on investment, with those graduating between FY17 and FY21 experiencing a 29 percent increase in their annual earnings just one year after completing their credential. This immediate salary boost underscores the effectiveness of UA programs in rapidly enhancing the earning potential of its students while meeting our state’s workforce needs.



## ACCELERATING ALASKA'S WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Workforce programs are on the rise at UAF CTC! While programs such as Auto, Welding Diesel/Heavy Equipment, Aviation Maintenance and more remain at full capacity, many others are joining them. The Culinary Arts program is seeing record enrollment this year reaching its capacity — a success driven by the quality of instruction (the program students recently won the 2025 Golden Ladle award) and study abroad options in Italy. Faculty lead, Associate Professor Sean Walklin, was recognized as the 2025 Emil Usibelli Distinguished Service Award recipient and was also recently named one of Alaska's Top 40 Under 40.

The Licensed Practical Nurse program has doubled its capacity to better meet the needs of employers and student demand and UAF CTC's Law Enforcement Academy is likewise now at full capacity.

With the recent move of the Interior Alaska Campus to CTC, UAF's AA and AS degree programs are now housed within CTC. Through more focused advising and curricular alignment, this will help CTC connect more students to baccalaureate degree pathways serving as a foundational college at UAF.

## COMMUNITY IMPACT

UAF CTC is becoming even more connected with local and national businesses who have the most recent expertise, employment needs, and market trends that allow CTC programs to be responsive and remain ever relevant. With strong partnerships in all of its workforce programs, UAF CTC stays focused on the immediate and future needs of the state. Recently added partnerships such as ESI with Diesel/Heavy Equipment, Lithia Chevrolet of Fairbanks with Automotive Technology, and Alaska Airlines continuing with Aviation Maintenance all add to the team of partners that help support UAF CTC and continue to provide a direct path to employment for program graduates.
