The Ketchikan Campus, founded in 1954, was the first community campus in the current UA system. Flagship local programs include marine transportation degrees and certifications through the UAS Maritime Training Center, along with programs in health sciences, welding, and other technical programs; and online interdisciplinary bachelor's degrees that allow flexibility for students to return to school to finish their degrees without leaving their home communities.

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
TRANSFORMING EDUCATION TO CAREER OUTCOMES

Graduates of UAS Ketchikan programs see a substantial return on investment, with those graduating between FY17 and FY21 experiencing a 9 percent increase in their annual earnings just one year after completing their credential. This immediate salary boost underscores the effectiveness of UA programs in rapidly enhancing the earning potential of its students while meeting our state's workforce needs.




ENROLLMENT PROFILE

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

The UAS Ketchikan Qualified Member of the Engine Department (QMED) course of study is a US Coast Guard approved sequence of courses. Earning this credential has significant advantages for those seeking entry into the Maritime field enabling them to secure employment in engine rooms on large maritime vessels. Successful completion of the QMED reduces the required sea service from 180 days to 120. The Maritime Training Center also offers 17 above deck US Coast Guard approved courses leading to Occupational Endorsements and Associate of Applied Science degrees.
