1. Call to Order and Roll Call
2. Review and Approve Agenda
Audrey moved to adopt as presented, seconded by Brittany. No objections.
3. Public and Guest Comments
 - a. Title IX Update - Mary
 - i. Investigator training in Fairbanks -- 20 investigators from around the state, and working with GC on process, includes HR and student conduct staff

- ii. Student training -- in-person training is being offered throughout October on most campuses; deadline for completion is Nov. 2; penalty of not completing is priority registration hold;
- iii. Staffing -- working to hire Title IX coordinators and backup; UAA - has coordinator and two new investigators and will hire a third shortly, as well as a student; UAF - title IX coordinator, lead investigator and hiring three additional investigators; UAS - has a coordinator and will hire a deputy coordinator this year; Title IX Contacts for all UA campuses is available online [HERE](#)
- iv. Culture of Respect -- what is the culture at UA and what do we want it to be? How do we grow the positive aspects of our culture? How do we stem the negative aspects? \$1.3M has been allocated to Title IX and creating this culture of respect
- v. UA Climate survey -- last done in 2017 and had over 700 students respond; will distribute another in February of 2019
- vi. In 2017, UA entered into an agreement (VRA) with the Office of Civil Rights (OCR) and agreed to a number of steps to bring UA into compliance; more information on UA's VRA is available online [HERE](#)
- vii. In-state Title IX training for students -- new training will be developed specifically for UA - built in Alaska - UA is supplying content and general intent and the contractor will develop the training to better represent the unique conditions of Alaska; plan to implement in Fall 2019
- viii. Mary encourages students to engage in bystander training, UAF has Green Dot and UAS, and Bring in the Bystander at UAA - will provide training for student groups

- ix. Policy on Reports of Misconduct -- proposed new policy will be approved in November (see item 4.C below)
- x. Mandatory reporters -- all UA employees are considered responsible employees and are required to report any instances of sexual harassment or assault that they may find out about; students are not required to report, however, if a student

becomes aware of an incident, they are strongly encouraged to report it; more information on responsible employees at UA is available online [HERE](#)

4. New Business

- a. Campus Free Speech - Oct. 12 event at UAA and will be a part of the Coalition Summit; Erwin Chemerinsky speech will also be live streamed; Fairbanks will broadcast it in the multilevel lounge at Wood Center and Juneau will broadcast it in the Egan Library, Room 104
- b. Student Compensation - President Johnsen noted at the September Board meeting he plans to review student compensation this year. The lowest rate of student employee pay was brought up to be in line with Alaska's minimum wage earlier this year, however, there hasn't yet been a comprehensive review of student employee pay. The president noted at the Board meeting he wanted to work with the Coalition on determining a new pay structure for UA student employees.
- c. New policy on reports of misconduct - [Reference](#) (updated link) - The UA Board of Regents first reviewed this proposed new policy at its September meeting. It will be on the Board's November agenda for approval. Students can provide feedback on the new policy through Oct. 15 either by commenting on the above doc or sending in an email.
