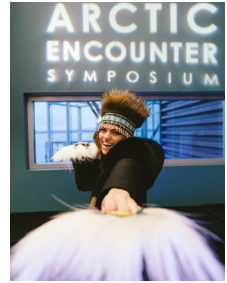


University of Alaska History

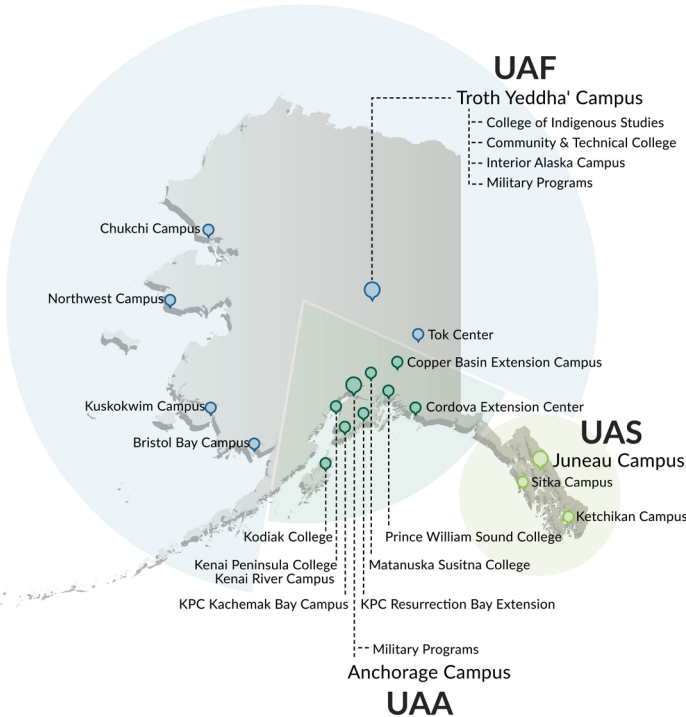
