

Preliminary Course Registration and Admission Activity, Spring 2026

Start of Instruction

January 12, 2026

This report compares activity between the first day of instruction for Spring 2026 (January 12, 2026) and Spring 2025 (January 13, 2025) semesters. Trends figures are normalized relative to the first day of instruction.

Closing Outlook

If current trends hold, nearly 22,066 students are anticipated to enroll by the close of Spring 2026, a projected increase of nearly 3 percent (563 students) over Spring 2025. Student credit hour (SCH) registration is anticipated to increase over 5 percent (8692 SCH), reaching more than 172,478 SCH by the end of the term. Graphs displaying historical and current system level course registration patterns for student headcount and SCH are provided on pages 9 and 10, respectively.

Course Registration

As of January 12, 2026, 17,396 students had registered for 166,850 Spring semester credit hours, system wide. This represents a nearly 3 percent increase in headcount (444 students) and more than a 5 percent increase in student credit hour registration (8,408 SCH) from the levels observed this time last year.

At UAA, student headcount increased nearly 6 percent (517 students) and student credit hours increased over 7 percent (6,480 SCH) compared to last year. The College of Arts and Sciences accounted for roughly 32 percent (2,067 SCH) of the net increase in SCH at UAA. See page 2 for additional UAA detail by academic unit.

UAF student headcount increased over 1 percent (75 students) and student credit hour registration increased over 4 percent (2,600 SCH), year-over-year. Spring 2026 student credit hour registration at the College of Natural Science and Mathematics accounted for nearly 59 percent (1,530 SCH) of UAF's net SCH increase. UAS headcount decreased more than 6 percent (107 students) and student credit hour registration decreased almost 6 percent (672 SCH) compared to this time last year. One area of growth was at Ketchikan Campus, experiencing registration SCH growth of more than 3 percent (68 SCH) compared to this time last year, offsetting declines at other units for Spring 2026. Over four percent of registered students (741 students) are taking classes concurrently at multiple universities within the system this semester.

Applications

About 5,318 prospective students started applications for the Spring 2026 term, compared to 5,261 applications initiated in Spring 2025. This is an increase of 1 percent (57 applications), year-over-year. About 60 percent of applications for Spring 2026 have resulted in admission to a program or course. Of the 3,180 students accepted so far, 57 percent (1,821) have elected to enroll at this time. This represents an decrease of 4 percent (82) year-over-year.

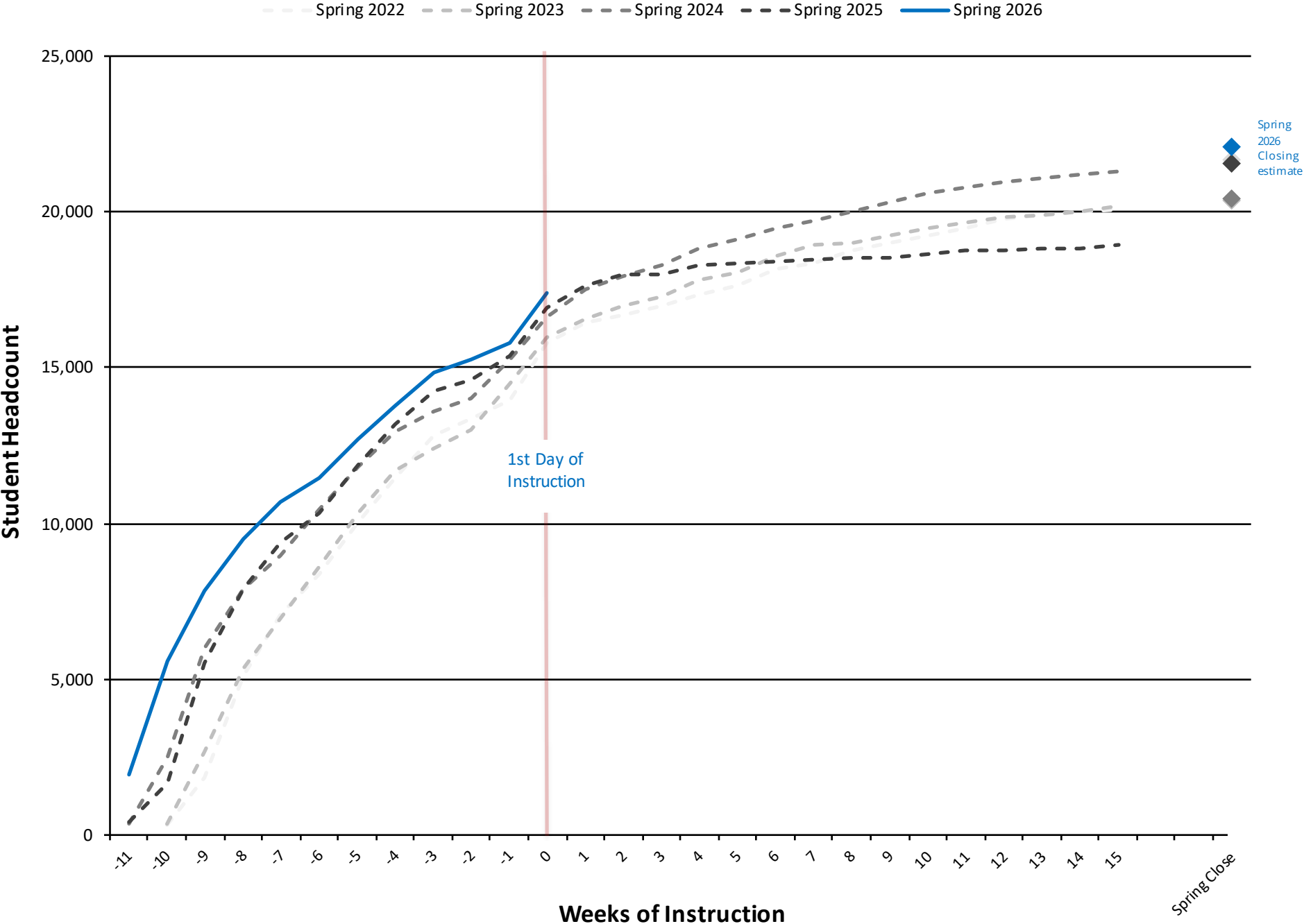
