

FISCAL YEAR STUDENT ENROLLMENT TABLE OF CONTENTS

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Summary: Fiscal Year Enrollment

Fiscal year enrollment reflects activity in consecutive Summer, Fall, and Spring terms. For example, FY26 represents the Summer 2025, Fall 2025 and Spring 2026 semesters. A student is counted if they enroll in at least one semester during the fiscal year.

All Students

The number of distinct students enrolled in one or more for-credit, or non-credit, courses decreased 11.8 percent (from 31,102 to 27,437 students) between FY22 and FY26 and held steady (from 27,195 to 27,437 students) between FY25 and FY26¹. The total number of students taking at least one for-credit course in FY26 was 26,813, a 1.8 percent increase from 26,333 in FY25. Of these, 53.7 percent (14,394 students) registered at UAA, 40.7 percent (10,923 students) at UAF, and the remaining 13.1 percent (3,523 students) at UAS². The total number of students enrolled in at least one non-credit course decreased by 27.4 percent from FY22 to FY26 (from 1,147 to 833 students). FY26 non-credit course enrollment also decreased 27.4 percent from FY25, with the total number of students enrolled in at least one non-credit course decreasing from 1,147 to 833³.

Total student credit hours (SCH) attempted increased 8.8 percent between FY22 – FY26, going from 363,538 to 395,560 SCH over this time. In the last year, SCH increased 5.6 percent, from 374,418 in FY25 to 395,560 in FY26⁴.

Total student full-time equivalents (FTE) increased 8.3 percent from FY22 to FY26, going from 12,440 to 13,472. In the last year, student FTE increased 5.7 percent (12,748 to 13,472) from FY25 to FY26⁵.

Dual Enrollment

Dual enrollment is enrollment in a postsecondary course by a K-12 student, on a university campus or at their school. This includes enrollment where a student earns both secondary and postsecondary credit as well as enrollment for which no K-12 credit is earned.

In FY26, 3,961 dual enrolled K-12 students attended UA, holding steady with 12 fewer students from 3,973 students in FY25 and a 23.1 percent (743 students) increase from 3,218 students in FY22. The number of K-12 students taking a class from UAA held steady with 19 fewer students, from 2,009 in FY25 to 1,990 in FY26. At UAF, the number of dual enrollment students attending decreased 5.8 percent (83 students), from 1,426 students in FY25 to 1,343 students in FY26. UAS dual enrollment student headcount increased 7.0 percent (52 students), increasing from 748 students to 800 during the same period. For comparison, Fall 2025 dual enrollment students reflects 72.8 percent of total FY26 student headcount for the UA system⁶.

Dual enrolled K-12 students attempted a total of 37,716 SCH in FY26, representing 9.5 percent of total credits delivered systemwide. The number of SCH attempted by K-12 students held steady

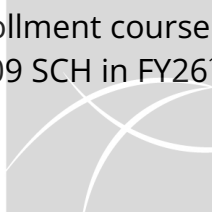
in the last year and increased 43.4 percent over the last five years, increasing from 37,485 in FY25 and from 26,310 SCH in FY22.

The number of credits attempted by dual enrollment students has grown at UAA, increasing 3.4 percent, from 22,049 in FY25 to 22,809 in FY26. UAF delivered 11,281 SCH to K-12 students in FY26, a 4.8 percent decrease from the FY25 level of 11,851 SCH. During the same period, SCH attempted by dual enrollment students at UAS increased by 1.1 percent, from 3,585 in FY25 to 3,626 in FY26⁷

The K-12 students dual enrolled at UA are located across the state. Categorizing dual enrollment students into Alaska census areas indicates that 85.9 percent (1,710 students) at UAA are from the census areas of Anchorage, Kenai Peninsula, Matanuska-Susitna, and Valdez-Cordova. Students from the census areas of Fairbanks North Star, Southeast Fairbanks, Denali, and the Yukon-Koyukuk make up 44.7 percent (600 students) of dual enrollment students at UAF. At UAS, roughly 61.8 percent (494 students) of dual enrollment students come from the census areas of Haines, Juneau, Ketchikan Gateway, Sitka, Skagway-Hoonah-Angoon, Wade Hampton, and Wrangell-Petersburg. Students from unknown census origins account for 5.4 percent (107 students), 1.4 percent (19 students), 1.4 percent (11 students), and 3.4 percent (135 students) at UAA, UAF, UAS, and systemwide dual enrollment respectively⁸

The median age of a K-12 student attending a UA campus in FY26 was 16. About 7.4 percent (293) of dual enrolled students were 14 years or younger, 15.6 percent (618) were 15 years old, 31.2 percent (1,235) were 16 years of age, 38.3 percent (1,519) were 17 years old, and the remaining 7.5 percent (296) were 18, 19, or unknown age in FY26⁹.

The top course taken by UAA and UAF dual enrolled students, in terms of headcount and SCH, was Writing 111 *Writing Across Contexts* with 490 and 307 students enrolled in 1,500 and 927 SCH respectively. The most popular dual enrollment course at UAS was Welding Technology 120 *Basic Welding*, with 102 students enrolled in 309 SCH in FY26¹⁰.
