

# GRADUATION RATES

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## Summary: Graduation Rates

Graduation rates in UA's four-year programs are still above the national average for public open admission institutions. The FY25 graduation rate for first-time, full-time freshman seeking any undergraduate degree was 38.0 percent which is nearly the same as FY18's 37.9 percent and the same as FY24's graduation rate of 38.0 (Table 1).

Graduation rates in UA's two-year or shorter programs have fluctuated considerably in recent years. The proportion of first-time, full-time freshman who pursued and earned a degree 2-years or less in length within 3 years changed significantly over the last seven years - from 20.7 percent in FY18 to 22.0 percent in FY24 and most recently, an all-time high of 30.3 percent in FY25. (Table 3). The proportion of indigenous first-time, full-time freshman who earned a degree 2-years or less in length within 3 years has increased 14.0 percentage points since FY18, reaching 19.8 percent in FY24 (Table 4).

Students receiving the UA Scholars award have higher graduation rates than other student aid recipient groups. First-time, full-time UA scholars seeking a bachelor's degree, and earning any undergraduate degree, graduate at a higher rate than any other group of students. Examining just the last three fiscal years, FY25, FY24, and FY23, 57.0 percent, 61.4 percent, 58.0 percent respectively of first-time full-time UA Scholar freshmen bachelor's degree seeking students earned any undergraduate degree in six years (Table 5). Comparatively, the overall graduation rates for UA students were 39.9 percent in FY25, 39.2 percent in FY24, and 38.4 percent in FY23 (Table 1).

Compared to similar institutions nationally, UA students are more likely to graduate. The national six-year baccalaureate graduation rate for students enrolling at public, four-year, open admission institutions was 27.9 percent in FY23 (NCES 2024<sup>1</sup>). The rate for UA students at that time was 31.8 percent, which is 3.9 percentage points higher than the national rate (Table 1). The most recent published national six-year baccalaureate graduation rate of indigenous, degree-seeking students enrolling at public, four-year, open admission institutions was 17.1 percent in FY23 (NCES 2024<sup>2</sup>). For indigenous students attending UA, 15.0 percent of those pursuing a bachelor's degree graduated within six years (FY20), 2.1 percentage points lower than the national average at similar institutions (Table 2).

The most recently published national six-year baccalaureate graduation rate for students enrolling at public, four-year, open admission institutions was 27.9 percent in FY23. About 31.8 percent of students pursuing a bachelors degree from UA graduated within six years, 4.1 percentage points more than the national average for similar institutions.

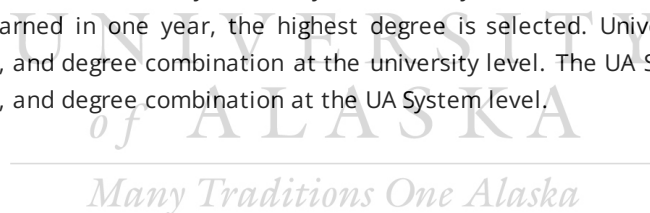
