

Looking Forward

- Challenges
 - **Process**-never been done before....while goals are shared and roles being clarified, rules of engagement are not fully developed
 - Fiscal-UA's fiscal / governance model is three independent universities
- Opportunities
 - Increased capacity-collective work of three units to improve student experience
 - **Efficiency**-streamline processes and eliminate redundancies
