Elimination of the Construction Technology Undergraduate Certificate

Attached is the Program Action Request (PAR) form seeking Board of Regents Action to eliminate the Construction Technology Undergraduate Certificate. Also attached is the UAA letter to the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) dated May 17, 2016 informing the NWCCU of the suspension of admissions to the program, and the NWCCU letter dated August 22, 2016 recognizing the suspension.

Admissions to the Undergraduate Certificate were suspended due to lack of interest. As there were no students in the program at the time of suspension, no teach out was required. Related to this action, the Technology AAS will be revised, due to lack of student interest in the construction technology track of that degree. There are no other impacts on programs or stakeholders. The budget has been reallocated to other Kodiak College community campus programs, and adjunct faculty positions have been eliminated.

Dear Dr. Elman,

This letter is to notify the Commission of the suspension of admissions into the Construction Technology and Industrial Safety Program Support Undergraduate Certificates, which are delivered solely on the Kodiak College community campus. Admission to the programs was suspended with intent to delete after accommodating existing students. The programs require 30 and 33 credits to complete respectively, and were approved in 2006.

The attached summary provides information about the considerations that went into this decision to suspend admissions into these programs. Since there are no students enrolled in either certificate, Kodiak College will proceed with deleting the programs through the normal curriculum process.

Suspension of admissions into a program is approved by the appropriate Campus Director, the Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, and the Chancellor. This notification will be submitted to the UA System Vice President for Academic Affairs and Research, so he can notify the Board of Regents.

We ask that the Commission update its record of UAA's programs to reflect this change. If you have questions, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Dear Assistant Vice Provost Carlson:

This is in reply to electronic correspondence received in our office on May 18, 2016, requesting approval from the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) for University of Alaska Anchorage (UAA) to suspend one bachelor's degree program, two master's degree programs, two graduate certificate programs, and two undergraduate certificate programs, effective May 2016. Consistent with UAA's suspension guidelines, suspension of admissions to these programs has been approved by the appropriate Dean, the Provost, and Executive Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, and the Chancellor. The abovementioned programs are as follows:

Student admission will be suspended for the following programs:

- Bachelor of Music degree program in Performance (122 Credits)
- Master of Civil Engineering degree program (30 Credits)
- Master of Science degree program in Arctic Engineering (30 Credits)
- Graduate Certificate program in Coastal, Ocean, and Port Engineering (15 Credits)
- Graduate Certificate program in Earthquake Engineering (15 Credits)
- Undergraduate Certificate program in Construction Technology (30 Credits)
- Undergraduate Certificate program in Industrial Safety Program Support (33 Credits)

The Commission has approved the suspension of the above-mentioned programs as minor changes under Commission Policy, Substantive Change. The Commission notes that the currently enrolled students in the abovementioned bachelor's and master's degree programs, and graduate and undergraduate certificate programs have been notified of the suspensions and advisors will assist these students in completing the programs while providing institutional services and resources to support them. Accordingly, the suspensions of the abovementioned programs are now included under the accreditation of University of Alaska Anchorage.
