Elimination of the Industrial Technology Undergraduate Certificate

Attached is the Program Action Request (PAR) form seeking Board of Regents Action to eliminate the Industrial Technology Undergraduate Certificate.

This certificate was approved in November 1997. When Prince William Sound College was brought into UAA's accreditation as community campus, the certificate was not brought into the UAA catalog, due to lack of student enrollment and interest and declining industrial relevance. The program curriculum has been merged into the Industrial Technology AAS to better meet industry needs, and the program elimination has been absorbed as part of the Prince William Sound College community campus's budget and workload reductions.
