Elimination of the Pharmacy Technology Undergraduate Certificate

Attached is the Program Action Request (PAR) form seeking Board of Regents Action to eliminate the Pharmacy Technology Undergraduate Certificate. Also attached is the UAA letter to the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) dated August 21, 2014 informing the NWCCU of the suspension of admissions to the program, and the NWCCU letter dated December 18, 2014 recognizing the suspension.

Admissions to the program were suspended in July 2005, because the off-campus leased space was no longer available, and adequate space for the program was not available on the Anchorage campus. As the program has been suspended long-term, this deletion will have no impact on other programs, stakeholders, or resources; the Undergraduate Certificate has been replaced by the Pharmacy Technology Occupational Endorsement Certificate, approved in 2007. The final decision to eliminate the program results from the Program Prioritization process.

The UAA program to be revised is as follows:

Occupational Endorsement Certificate program for Veterinary Assisting

The Commission has approved the abovementioned deletions, suspensions, and revision of UAA curricula as *minor changes* under Commission Policy, *Substantive Change*. The Commission notes that enrolled students were accommodated to complete their studies. Accordingly, the deletions, suspensions, and revision of the abovementioned UAA curricula are now included under the accreditation of University of Alaska Anchorage.

Those changes mentioned in your correspondence previously approved by NWCCU remain in the institution's folder as approved.
