Attached is the Program Action Request (PAR) form seeking Board of Regents action to discontinue the Computer Information and Office Systems Associate of Applied Science, Also attached is the UAA letter to the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) dated March 30, 2016 informing the NWCCU of the suspension of admissions to the program.

Admissions to the program with intended deletion were suspended as a result of low student enrollment, shifts in employer demand, and faculty retirements. Admissions were suspended for Anchorage and Kenai in 2014; Mat-Su in 2015; and Kodiak in 2016.

Consistent with UAA's suspension guidelines, a teach out has been completed at all sites and no students remain in the program. There are no resources or faculty tied to the program. There are no other impacts on programs or stakeholders.

Dear Dr. Elman,

This letter is to notify the Commission of the suspension of admissions into the Computer Information and Office Systems AAS at the Kodiak College delivery site. Admission to the program was suspended with intent to delete after accommodating existing students. This follows suspension of admissions into the program in 2015 at the other three delivery sites in Anchorage, Mat-Su, and Kenai Peninsula. Substantive change fees were paid at that time. The program requires 60 credits to complete, and was approved under its current name in 2003.

The attached summary provides information about the considerations that went into this decision to suspend admissions into this program. Consistent with UAA's suspension guidelines, the campus has submitted a plan to accommodate the program's current majors and a plan to communicate with students and other stakeholders. Institutional services and resources will continue to be available to students as they complete this program.

All of the delivery sites have agreed to submit the program for deletion through the appropriate approval processes after admitted students have been accommodated according to their catalog year.

Suspension of admissions into a program is approved by the appropriate Dean/Campus Director, the Provost and Executive Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, and the Chancellor. This notification will be submitted to the UA System Vice President for Academic Affairs and Research, so he can notify the Board of Regents.

We ask that the Commission update its record of UAA's programs to reflect this change. If you have questions, please do not hesitate to contact us.
