Discontinuation of the Computer Electronics Associate of Applied Science

Attached is the Program Action Request (PAR) form seeking Board of Regents action to discontinue the Computer Electronics Associate of Applied Science. Also attached is the UAA letter to the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) dated April 20, 2015 informing the NWCCU of the suspension of admissions to the program.

Admissions to the program were suspended in 2015 with planned deletion due to low student enrollment and lack of industry interest in the program. The degree is delivered solely by the Kenai Peninsula College community campus. In terms of workforce opportunities, students are better served by the high demand Industrial Process Instrumentation Associate of Applied Science, also delivered by the Kenai Peninsula College community campus.

Consistent with UAA's suspension guidelines, a teach out has been completed and no students remain in the program. There are no resources or faculty tied to the program. There are no other impacts on programs or stakeholders.



Dear Dr. Elman,

This letter is to notify the Commission of the suspension of the Computer Electronics AAS. This program was initially approved by the Commission in 1985. Admission to the program was suspended with the intention to submit it for deletion after accommodating existing students. The Computer Electronics AAS requires 60 credits to complete.

The attached summary provides information about the considerations that went into this decision to suspend the program. Consistent with UAA's suspension processes, the college has submitted a plan to accommodate the program's current majors and a plan to communicate with students and other stakeholders. Institutional library, student services, and academic services are sufficient and will continue to be available to students as they complete this program.

This program suspension has received approvals from the Kenai Peninsula College Campus Director, the Provost and Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, and the Chancellor. University of Alaska System program suspension procedures do not require approval by the Board of Regents. This notification is being submitted concurrently to the UA System Vice President for Academic Affairs and Research. The Vice President will include this program in his summary of new program suspensions to the Board.
