RE: Discontinuation of the Industrial Technology Associate of Applied Science

Attached is the Program Action Request (PAR) form seeking Board of Regents (BOR) action to discontinue the Associate of Applied Science in Industrial Technology. Also attached is the notice of intent to suspend admissions which was provided to the BOR Academic and Student Affairs Committee on February 23, 2018. The university was notified of the committee's non-objection on March 12, 2018.

Admissions to the program were suspended in March 2018 with planned deletion due to limited student enrollment.

Consistent with UAA's suspension guidelines, a teach out of all students in the program has been completed and no students remain in the program. There are no resources or faculty tied to the program. There are no other impacts on programs or stakeholders.

Per discussion at the September 8, 2016, Academic & Student Affairs (A&SA) Committee meeting, I am providing notice of intent to suspend enrollment in the following academic program.

The University of Alaska Anchorage (UAA) plans to suspend enrollment in the following academic program in preparation for seeking future approval from the Board of Regents for discontinuation or reduction of the program.

Associate of Applied Science in Industrial Technology, UAA

The proposed suspension of admissions leading to discontinuation of the AAS Industrial Technology delivered by the Prince William Sound Community College (PWSC) community campus is due to lack of interest and low enrollments. The degree has two focus areas, and incoming students will continue to have options for study in these areas. Students interested in Millwright can earn the Millwright OEC and continue into the Apprenticeship Technology AAS. Students interested in safety management can earn the Occupational Safety and Health AAS, and the Anchorage and PWSC faculty are coordinating delivery of the online courses for that degree. Active majors will be taught out by May 2020.

If a committee member notifies me within seven calendar days that he/she wishes to discuss the program at the next A&SA Committee meeting, no action to suspend enrollment will occur prior to that discussion. To avoid Open Meetings Act violations, discussion should be limited to the meeting.
