The UAF Faculty Senate moves to delete the BS-ANTH: Anthropology, Bachelor of Science

EFFECTIVE: Fall 2023

RATIONALE: Historically we have offered both a BA and a BS in Anthropology. The former was centrally focused on sociocultural and linguistic anthropology, while the latter was focused primarily on biological anthropology and archeology. Due to lack of sufficient numerical competency skills among our students, including those interested in the BS program (enrollment and retention have been problematic for a decade), we are eliminating it. Consequently, we are redesigning the BA program so that it provides students with a broad exposure to all four subfields of anthropology. In addition, we have added to the courses that focus on methods to ensure that students take courses dedicated explicitly to methods, rather than hope that they receive instruction in applicable methods as an ancillary outcome of successful completion of the entire curriculum.

Notification of Currently Enrolled Students: Students will be notified via email, to an approved UA email address: Students will also be notified via telephone.

Teach-Out Timeframe: All the courses that are required for the soon-to-be discontinued B.S. degree in Anthropology will now be either required (ANTH 211x, 221, 215/260, 411) or continued to be offered as electives (ANTH 309/315, 405, 415/422, 423, 424, 426/428/492) for the new B.A. degree in Anthropology (start semester: Fall 2022).

As a result, we do not anticipate that there will come a date after which B.S. students will no longer be able to fulfill their requirements.
