**What is the Alaska Performance Scholarship (APS)?**

The Alaska Performance Scholarship provides an opportunity for Alaska high school students to earn a scholarship to help cover the cost of an Alaska postsecondary education.

Who can receive the APS?

Residents who graduate from an Alaska high school (public, private, or home school), complete a specified rigorous curriculum, meet GPA and college placement or work ready exam score requirements, can earn an Alaska Performance Scholarship.

Where can the APS be used?

The APS can be used at the University of Alaska; at other participating colleges or universities in Alaska, or for approved career and technical education programs in the state.

How much is the APS?

There are three annual award levels - renewable for up to 4 years:

Level 1: \$4,755 • Level 2: \$3,566 • Level 3: \$2,378

Award levels are established based on a combination of minimum GPA and test scores. Students may remain eligible for up to 8 semesters, but must fully use the APS within six years of high school graduation.
