# DISPOSAL PLAN

## Statewide Carbon Credit Program Copper River, Fairbanks, and Seward Meridians

### Copper River, Fairbanks, and Seward Meridians, Alaska

The University of Alaska (“University”) intends to dispose of certain interests relating to carbon credits for up to 100 years on approximately 21,000 acres of University landholdings throughout the State of Alaska. This disposal will be completed through a competitive bidding process at or above fair market value and will not convey land or mineral estates out of University ownership; only those interests relating to carbon credits will be transferred for the term of the credit. Development of parcels included in the carbon credit program will be limited until the carbon credit program matures. Lands classified for investment and educational may be included in the program. All comments received during the public notice period will be considered prior to starting the competitive bidding process.
